APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Admission to Medicine is very competitive in Canada.

The admissions committee assesses non-academic qualities, including compassion, reliability, responsibility, creativity, and leadership.

Basic requirements:

- A Bachelor Degree (in any academic area) with 90% GPA
- Reference letters from professors
- A personal essay
- A Medical School Entrance Exam (MCAT)
- An interview
- Volunteer or Paid Work experience in a hospital or medical clinic
